Each year over 4,000 people in Ireland develop dementia – that’s over 11 people every day. Fear and stigma surround dementia, that can result in delaying a diagnosis, and unnecessary loneliness and isolation for people living with dementia and their families.

Understand Together, a public support, awareness and information campaign led by the HSE working with the Alzheimer Society of Ireland and Genio, aims to tackle this stigma to create an Ireland that embraces and includes people living with dementia and their loved ones.

The Government has announced a public consultation on how it could deliver a statutory scheme that would provide homecare to people in Ireland. This is a huge opportunity for older people and their families to ensure we put in place a system that provides the home supports so many people need, but so few get.

The people who use homecare are the real experts and their families are the real experts and that's why it's important they hear from you.
